COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS WILL APPLY ON THE SHOWGROUND

- The health and safety of competitors and their support teams, volunteers, and the community, is our top priority. COVID-19 presents an unprecedented situation and as government guidance is evolving, we will provide, on Facebook – Robertson Show prior to the Show, current measures and safety protocols that will apply at the Show.
- Please stay home if you are sick or are considered high risk.
- You may respectfully be asked to leave the Showground if you do not comply with guidelines, including following all hygiene and physical distancing guidelines. Should this occur to a competitor, entry fees will not be refunded.
- Marshalls will be on-site. We ask that you be polite and follow their directions.
- Participants shall practice social distancing consistent with guidelines in effect at the time. Participants shall avoid congregating to the extent possible.
- When waiting to go into the ring for judging, exhibitors should keep the required distance apart, as they will also do in the ring.
- Wearing of masks will be subject to the current Covid rules.
- Sanitiser will be provided around the grounds and at ring entrances for use by exhibitors.
- Participants shall avoid shaking hands, hugging or other physical contact.

- Sign in with QR code will be required.
- EXHIBITORS, COMPETITORS & STALLHOLDERS REQUIREMENT UNDER WORK HEALTH & SAFETY ACT 2011**

Any person using electrical equipment (power leads/devices/appliances etc) whilst on the Showground is required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers & that all such leads/appliances/devices etc have been inspected & tagged by a licensed electrical contractor.

Persons who do not comply with the above regulations will not be permitted to exhibit, operate a stand/stall, or compete on the show ground.

Robertson A & H Society Inc. reserves the right to disconnect any electrical leads/devices/equipment that do not comply with the above regulation.

To avoid any problems arising in regard to the above regulations it is advised that you check your electrical equipment BEFORE you come to the Showground. Electrical leads are not permitted to be trailed along the ground unprotected from the power source. The Show Society appreciates your co-operation.

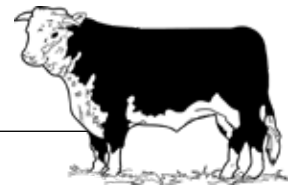

Beef Cattle Regulations



1. Owners & exhibitors must be in total control of cattle, exercising due caution regarding public safety and public liability & livestock insurance.
2. Those using electrical equipment must follow requirements of the Work Health & Safety Act 2011. see Notice, back page.
3. Age as at April 1st, 2022.
4. All cattle must be paraded on the day of the show as Committee requires. All ribbon winners to join Grand Parade.
5. Duplicate or photo copy of registration certificate of Pure Bred cattle must accompany entries, for return on judging day.
6. All exhibits under 18 months may be mouthed prior to judging in accordance with RAS regulations. Cattle not complying will be re-graded accordingly.
7. Cattle to be stalled by 8.30 am in allocated areas & ready when Stewards call their class.
8. All bulls over 12 months must be rung. All bulls under 12 months to have a nose grip.
9. All females must be paraded with a nose grip.
10. All Poll and dehorned cattle must be stalled with neck straps.
11. A calf of the exhibit is admitted if it is under the age of 8 months on the day & is being suckled by the exhibit. RAS regulation No 6
12. Exhibitors supply own Bedding.
13. All cattle must comply with NSW Dept. of Agriculture Health Regulations.
14. Exhibitors must attach Johnnes Declaration to warrant tested free stall areas.
15. All exhibitors must attach Pesti Virus Free test certificate.
16. ALL CATTLE MUST BE TAGGED WITH NLIS TAGS
17. ALL STALLS TO BE KEPT & LEFT CLEAN & TIDY.
18. Indemnity forms MUST be signed by all competitors.

BRITISH & EUROPEAN (including Bos Indicus) TO BE JUDGED SEPARATELY

NOTE: Classes may be re-grouped at the discretion of the Chief Steward. Ribbons to 3rd place, Broad Ribbons to Champions and Reserves. Cash Prizes - Classes - 1st \$10, 2nd \$5 (at least 3 entries in class).

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR - BEEF CATTLE: Trophy - *sponsored by Highlands Property*
The winner being the highest point scorer out of all breeds. No additional points for Champions and Reserve.
Point Scores: 1st = 3, 2nd = 2, 3rd = 1

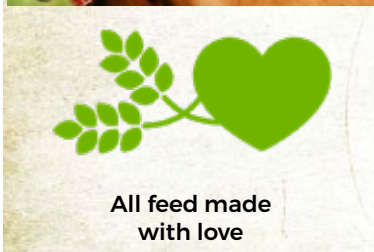

BEEF CATTLE YOUNG JUDGING COMPETITION

The South Coast and Tablelands Show Societies Inc (Group 5) have organised a Beef Cattle Young Judging Competition to be held on Sat 12th March at Robertson Show as part of the Beef Show competitions.

JUDGING: will commence at the completion of the Show Classes, not before 10am.

COMPETITORS will be asked to judge three groups of cattle - consisting of four head in each group, placing them in their respective order of 1st, 2nd 3rd & 4th.

Each group will judge the three groups of cattle in rotation. 50 points will be allocated for the placement of each group for a total of 150 points.

On completion of the judging up to 10 top marked competitors in the senior and intermediate sections will be asked to give, over the microphone, their comments on the placement of their nominated breed. A further 50 points will be allocated for this oral section.

Two competitors, aged over 15 and under 25 years as at 1 May 2022, will be selected on the day to represent Group 5 at the 2022 Sydney Royal Show to compete in the State Beef Cattle Junior Judging Competition.

Competitors can compete in only one Group Final but it is not necessary to reside within the boundaries of the Group conducting the Final. No competitor can represent more than one Show Society in any Group Final and no more than one group in a State Final. The winners of the National Final cannot compete at any level in the particular competition that they won. **Entries will be accepted on judging morning up until 8.30am.** However, to assist with catering and administration it would be appreciated if schools could advise the number of anticipated competitors and send completed entry forms by Fri 4th Feb to the Secretary Sue Sharpe on 02 46580897 or mobile 0410545463.
